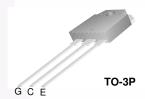

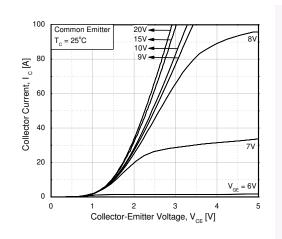


Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics

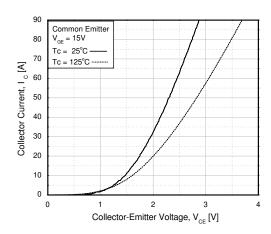


Fig 2. Typical Saturation Voltage Characteristics

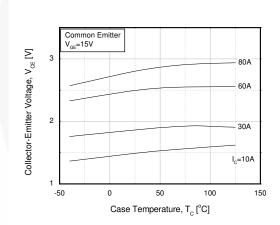


Fig 3. Saturation Voltage vs. Case
Temperature at Varient Current Level

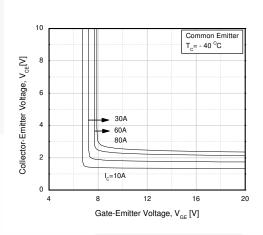


Fig 4. Saturation Voltage vs. V<sub>GE</sub>

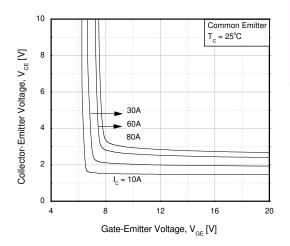


Fig 5. Saturation Voltage vs.  $V_{\text{GE}}$ 

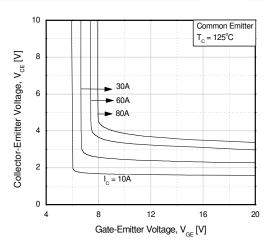
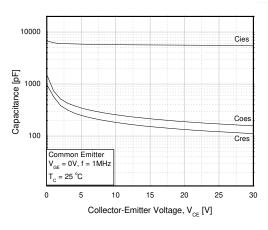


Fig 6. Saturation Voltage vs.  $V_{\rm GE}$ 



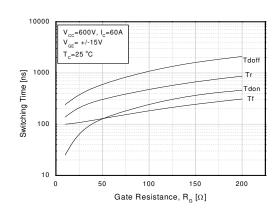
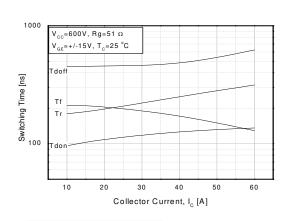


Fig 7. Capacitance Characteristics

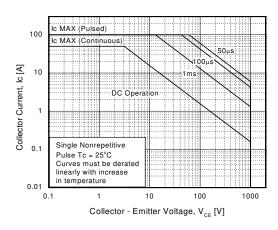
Fig 8. Switching Characteristics vs. Gate Resistance

Fig 10. Gate Charge Characteristics



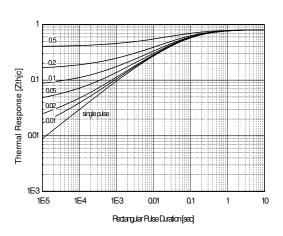
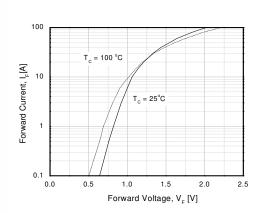


Fig 11. SOA Characteristics

Fig 12. Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT



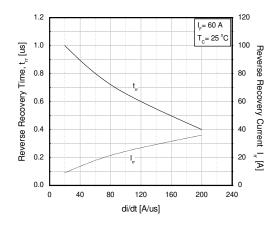
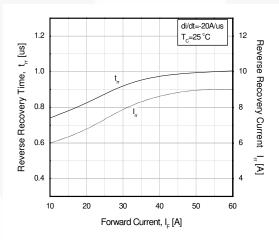


Fig 13. Forward Characteristics

Fig 14. Reverse Recovery Characteristics vs. di<sub>F</sub>/dt



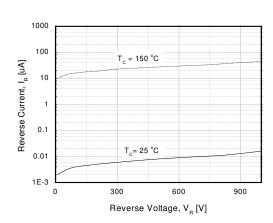


Fig 15. Reverse Recovery Characteristics vs. Forward Current

Fig 16. Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

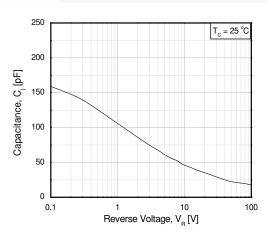


Fig 17. Junction capacitance

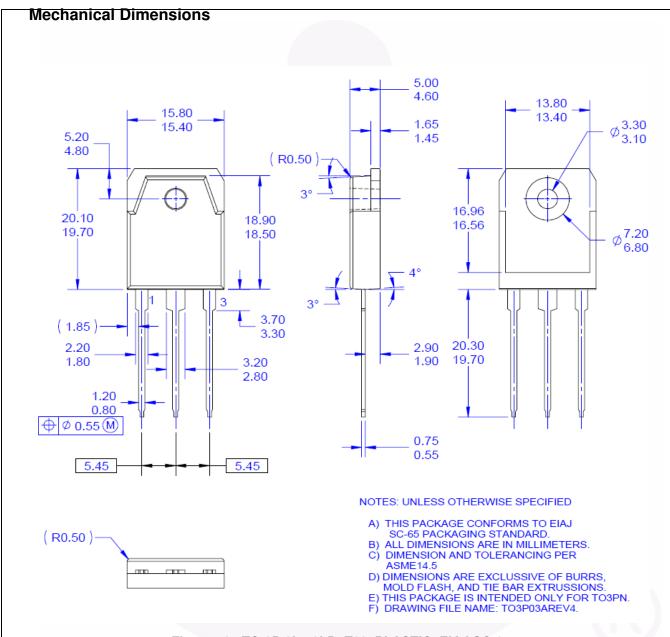


Figure 18. TO-3P 3L - 3LD, T03, PLASTIC, EIAJ SC-65

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
