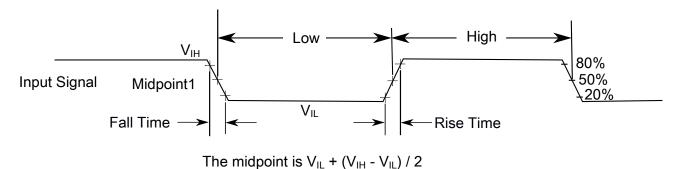


Figure 1. Input signal measurement reference

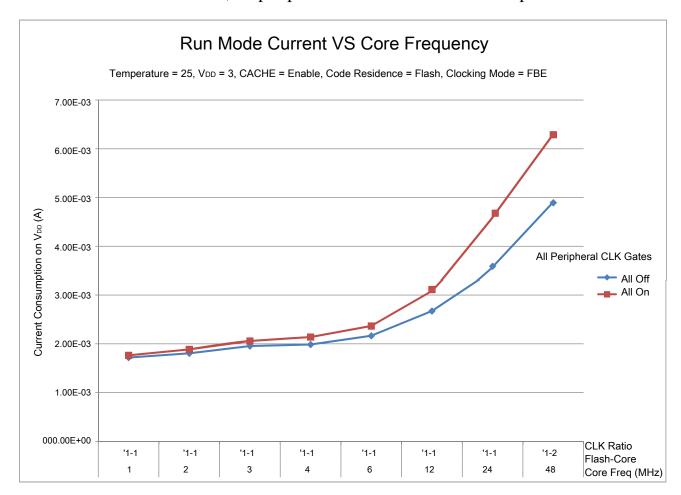


Figure 2. Run mode supply current vs. core frequency



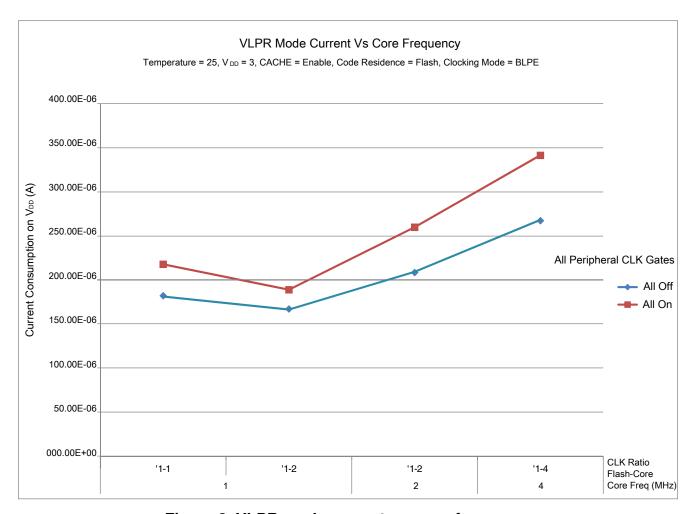


Figure 3. VLPR mode current vs. core frequency

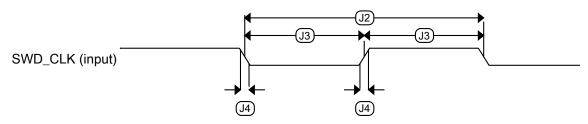


Figure 4. Serial wire clock input timing

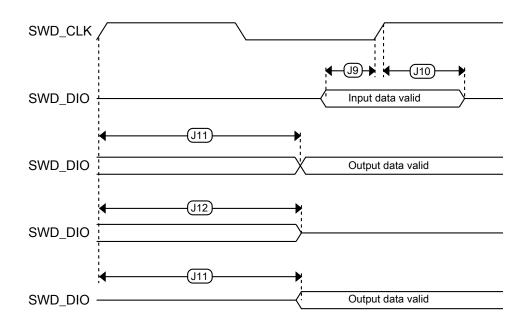


Figure 5. Serial wire data timing
