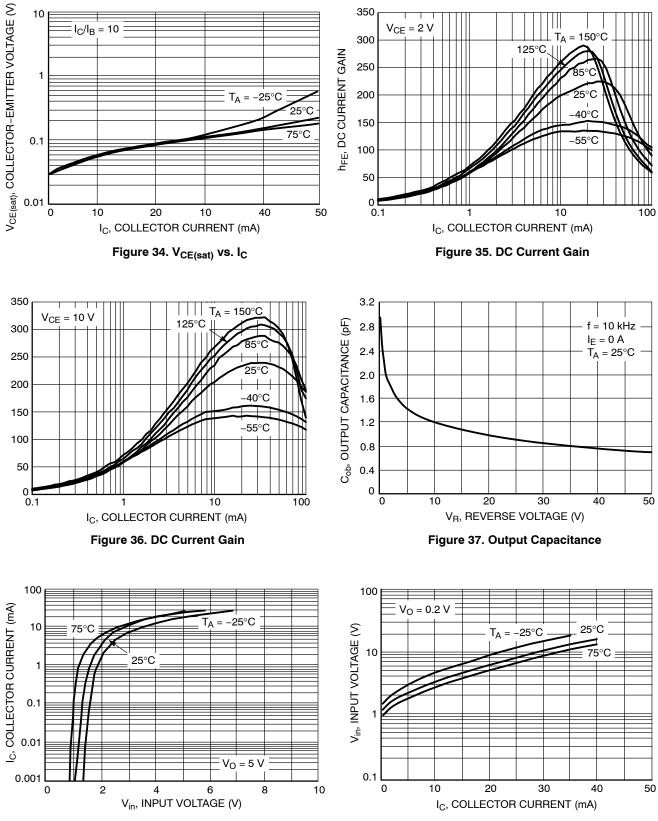
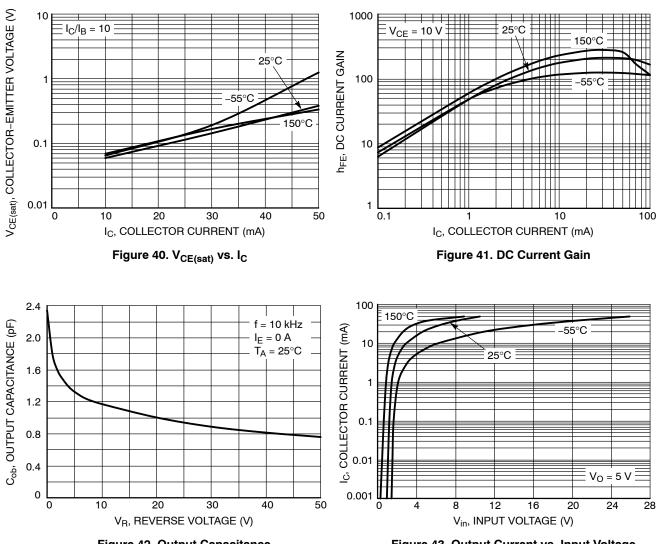
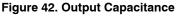


Figure 38. Output Current vs. Input Voltage

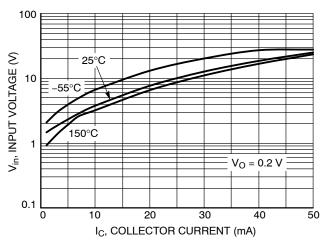
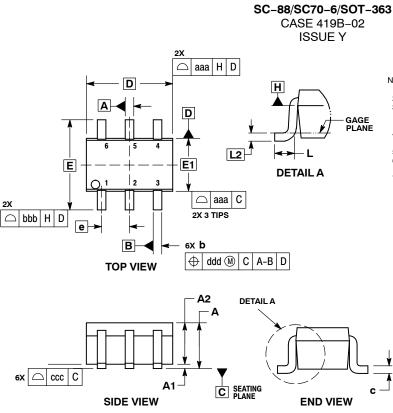


Figure 44. Input Voltage vs. Output Current
