### **Description**

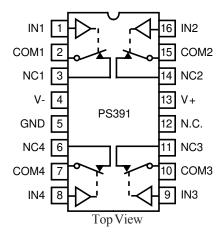
The PS391/PS392/PS393 are improved, quad, single-pole single-throw (SPST) analog switches designed to operate with  $\pm 3V$  to  $\pm 8V$  power supplies or a single 3V to 15V supply. The PS391 has four normally closed (NC) switches, the PS392 has four normally open (NO) switches. The PS393 has two NO and two NC switches. All three devices offer low leakage (<2pA typ) and fast switching speeds (toN <130ns). Power consumption is less than 1  $\mu$ A, ideal for battery-powered equipment.

With  $\pm 5V$  supplies, the PS391/PS392/PS393 guarantee <20hm channel-to-channel matching, <30ohm on-resistance ( $R_{ON}$ ), and <40hm  $R_{ON}$  flatness over the specified range.

These switches are fully specified for single +5V operation, with <20hm  $R_{ON}$  match, <45ohm  $R_{ON}$ , and <4ohm flatness.

For operation below 5V, the PI5A391A/PI5A392A/PI5A393A are also recommended

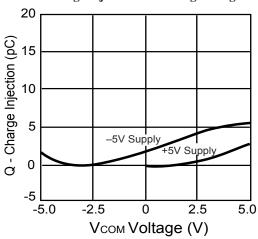

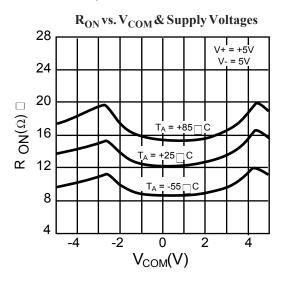


 $R_{ON}$  vs.  $V_{COM}$  (Single Supply)

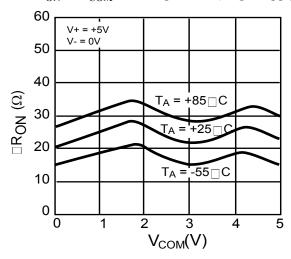


Charge Injection vs. Analog Voltage

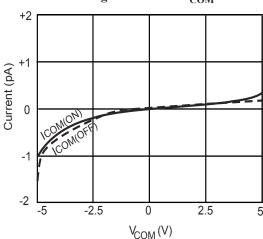




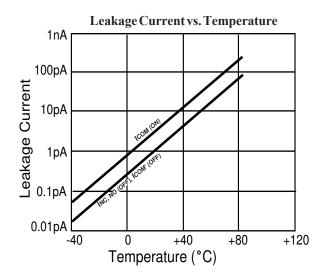
 $R_{ON}vs.V_{COM}$  and Temperature (Single Supply)

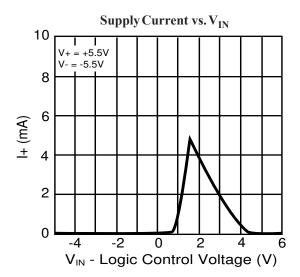


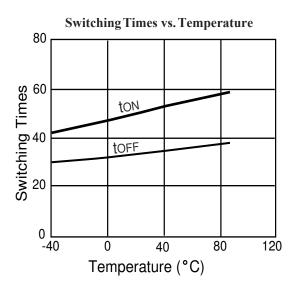
Leakage Current vs.  $V_{COM}$ 

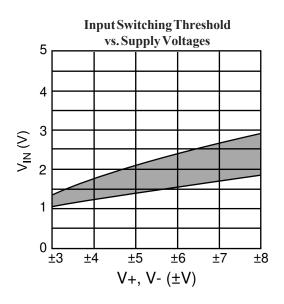


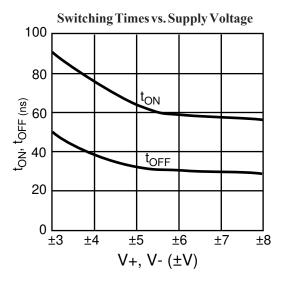

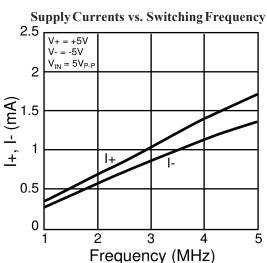

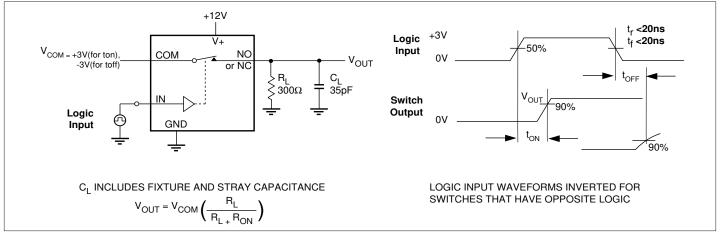


Figure 1. Switching Time

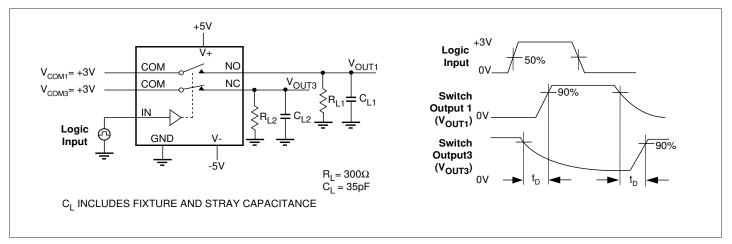


Figure 2. Break-Before-Make Interval (PS393 only)

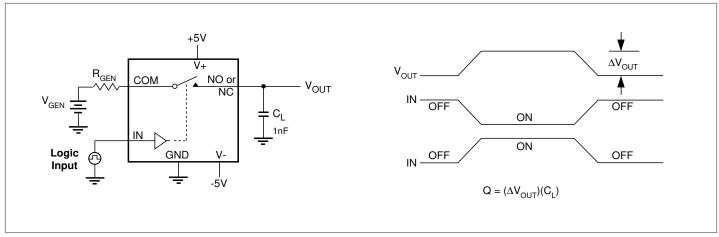


Figure 3. Charge Injection

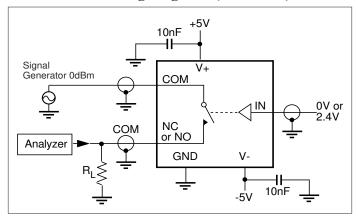


Figure 4. Off Isolation

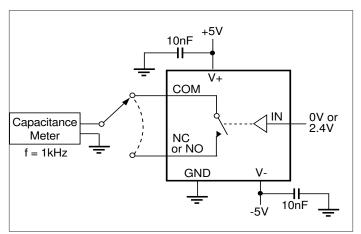


Figure 6. Channel-Off Capacitance

Figure 8. Programmable Integrator and Sample/Hold

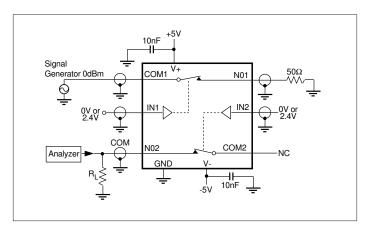


Figure 5. Crosstalk

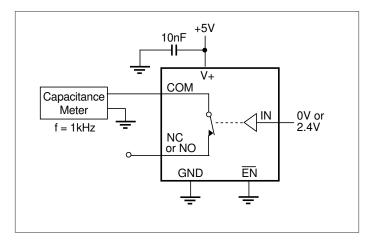


Figure 7. Channel-On Capacitance



### Overvoltage Protection

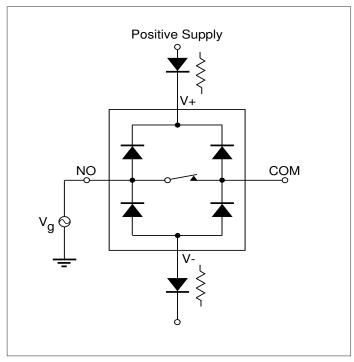


Figure 9. Overvoltage protection is accomplished using two external blocking diodes or two current limiting resistors.

Proper power-supply sequencing is recommended for all CMOS devices. Do not exceed the absolute maximum ratings, because stresses beyond the listed ratings may cause permanent damage to the devices. Always sequence V+ on first, followed by V-, and then the logic inputs. If power-supply sequencing is not possible, add two small signal diodes or two current limiting resistors in series with the supply pins for overvoltage protection (Figure 9). Adding diodes reduces the analog signal range, but low switch resistance and low leakage characteristics are unaffected.
