



Figure 2. Average forward current versus ambient temperature $(\delta = 0.5, \text{ per diode})$







Figure 3. Normalized avalanche power derating versus pulse duration

Figure 4. Normalized avalanche power derating versus junction temperature








Figure 5. Non repetitive surge peak forward current versus overload duration (maximum values, per diode)

Figure 6. Relative variation of thermal impedance junction to ambient versus pulse duration






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Figure 7. Reverse leakage current versus reverse voltage applied (typical values, per diode)

Figure 8. Junction capacitance versus reverse voltage applied (typical values, per diode)







Figure 9. Forward voltage drop versus forward current (per diode)






